

Energy End Use Database for the Calendar Years 2012 to 2016

The Energy End Use Database allows you to generate a customised report by choosing a number of display and filter options, the details of which are listed below.

How to use the view and filter options:

Choose View Options

This section allows you to choose a single year or compare several years at once and gives you three options to choose how you want your results displayed:

Select Year

Select the year or years you would like to display or "select all" to view all available years.

Data to Display

Select up to three categories you would like to see displayed from the list provided. For example if you select End Use, Fuel and Sector, then you will see the data broken down into these three categories.

Unit to Display

Use this dropdown list to choose which unit you wish to see the results displayed in. There are many options including energy and greenhouse gas units.

Sort Data

Choose how you would like the data sorted when it is displayed. You can either sort it alphabetically based on the list of categories you have selected or you can sort it by value.

Aggregated or Full Lists

You have the option to display your selected categories in full lists or aggregated lists. Note this does not affect the filters at all, only what is displayed

Choose Filter Options

This section lets you filter the data so that only records that match your search criteria are displayed. You may select up to seven different filters (one from each dropdown list). Make sure "No Filter" is selected if you do not wish to filter a particular part of the database.

End use

Use this dropdown list to see the results from only one Energy End Use. End Uses are what the energy is ultimately used for, such as heating, lighting, transport or other processes.

Fuel

Use this dropdown list to choose to see the results from only one type of fuel.

Sector

Use this dropdown list to see results from a specific economic sector such as forestry or primary metal or education.

Technology

Use this dropdown list to see results from a specific technology. Energy is used by various technologies such as combustion engines, boilers or electronics.

Transport

Use this dropdown list to see results from a specific transport mode. Note there is also an option to see non-transport values here as well.

Building

Use this dropdown list to see results used either in buildings or not in buildings.
